- 1. Audit forms at the RSYS expire on August 31 each year as per Notice of Race (NoR) 4.1.
- 2. Audits for RSYS Members will take place at a time pre-arranged through the Sailing Office. Audits are subject to the availability of an Australian Sailing (AS) and RSYS accredited Equipment Auditor.
- 3. Equipment Audits shall only be completed on the official forms provided by AS/RSYS.
- 4. All gear shall be laid out for inspection. Where equipment is not adequately laid out, the Equipment Auditor may refuse to continue the audit. The boat's 'owner' or 'person in charge' shall be in attendance during the audit.
- 5. Where a boat has 'outstanding items' still required as part of its audit, it shall be ineligible to race.

  Outstanding items shall be presented with the audit form to sign off, to an AS/RSYS accredited Equipment Auditor.
- 6. Under AS Special Regulations 2.02, every boat may be subject to a 'spot check' equipment audit. A boat whose equipment is found to be non-complying or whose 'owner' or 'person in charge' acts unreasonably in preventing a 'spot check', may be subject to protest by the Race Committee.
- 7. **Inflatable life jackets** to be checked annually by an approved servicing agent. Signed and dated proof of service must be provided for each lifejacket.
- 8. **Fire Extinguishers** must be checked annually by an approved servicing agent with proof of annual check attached.
- 9. **Sling Inspection** All lifting equipment must be fit for purpose and checked annually by an approved servicing agent with proof of annual service attached.
- 10. Boat Registration All boats must be registered with Roads and Maritime Services (RMS).
