The Beautiful Curtis Coast

We eventually had the right conditions to make it back to the Capricornia Cays National Park, spending three days at North West Island. The snorkelling was awesome, with sharks and manta rays as well as the full array of coral and tropical fish. It was sad to say goodbye to the Southern Great Barrier Reef, but on our way back in, we saw our first whale. We have seen humpbacks every day since then, spouting, fin slapping, breaching and even power napping!

The islands in this area are quite beautiful, pristine and many have coral. Most are maintained by QLD National Parks who allow camping by permit only, helping to keep the unspoiled nature of the islands. One of our favourites has been Hexham, a great anchorage with a small pretty beach and a great hill scramble for awesome views and internet access!

Wine-Dark Sea has also made the pilgrimage to Middle Percy, leaving some memorabilia in the famous AFrame. We had three fantastic days at the Percys, hiking the track to the Homestead and meeting Cate, the current leaseholder, who told us a lot of the history of the island.
